- 2. The Role of Career Counselling Cell is quite effective and further advised to strengthen the activities.
- 3. The preparedness of the faculty is however complete, the empty post of the faculties imposed over workloads to many faculties. Moreover new syllabus is implemented in 2016 simultaneously to each year, also requires a thorough preparation. Hence, faculties are advised to prepare as per the requirements of the syllabus and the student needs.
- 4. The student placement, Participation in sports and cultural activities, extension work, inculcation of values among students by celebration of national and cultural festivals are some of the best practices of the institutions and suggested to continue.

ANNEXURE-5 TWO BEST PRACTICES OF THE INSTITUTION

- 1. One of the best practices of the institution is to motivate the students to understand the format of the different competitive exams through the lectures of the experts to be arranged by IQAC for them. Since most of the students belong to the poor and backward class of society, approach to college education after passing Higher Secondary Education/12th from remote rural areas with no academic facilities hardly equipped with sound knowledge about the characteristics of different competitive exams. At such juncture to acknowledge them about such exams, format of them, how to prepare for them, how to assist internet to download referential materials- are proved to be the highly beneficial for them. The large numbers of students including girl students appear in Lok Rakshak Dal exam, Forest Guard Exam and etc.
- 2. The second best practices of the institution are to establish direct contact with the parent of those students who used to remain absent in lectures or bunk classes regularly. The result of this decision is maximum number of present students are observed in lectures resulted into the decrease ratio in' FAIL or ATKT'.
- 3. The third best practices of the institution are to build up confidence in students through continuous computer training and through it Skill Development.
